Energy Stewardship

By now you likely have heard that Northwest Hills is engaging in an effort to become a better steward of our energy. It is not that we have thoughtlessly wasted energy in the past, but with the application of new technology and through giving closer scrutiny to how we plan the use of our space, we soon could be realizing some significant savings on our energy costs. A company by the name of "Ideal Impact" is helping us in this process.



The two main areas of emphasis are our lighting and air conditioning. But this does *not* mean that we will be expecting people to sit in the dark and swelter! Certainly, *one* way to cut our energy costs would be to completely turn off our lights and air conditioning - but that is NOT going to happen! Our intent is not to make people uncomfortable, just to be more aware of and intentional about the energy we use.

And that's where we *all* can play a role. For example, we all can be more conscious of our use of lighting. If there is no one in a room, it really doesn't need to be lit! So, if you are the last one to leave a room, please turn out the lights when you leave. This applies to meeting rooms, bathrooms, storage rooms, mechanical rooms, and offices. It also applies to hallways after hours.

Even more significant savings will be realized through the wise use of our air conditioning. As with lighting, in most cases unoccupied rooms do not need to be air conditioned - at least not to the 72° +/- range that most of us find comfortable. So, when a Sunday school class is over, or when a meeting is concluded, or when a Bible study is

finished, if you are the last one to leave the room, please tap the setting on the thermostat to raise the temperature to the mid-80s.

Another area in which we can have a significant impact on our air conditioning usage is with regard to the scheduling of rooms (other than on Sunday mornings). For example: each of our air conditioners serves from two to four separate rooms. If two or three events are planned for the same evening, it will be much more efficient to schedule those events in rooms being served by the same air conditioning unit, rather than to have them scattered throughout our buildings. Further savings can be realized if we also factor in the size of the air conditioning unit serving the rooms. For example: it would use less energy if those meetings were scheduled in a group of rooms served by a 2.5 ton unit instead of a 3.5 ton unit. This might mean that we don't always get to use the room to which we have become accustomed, or that we don't necessarily get the same room every time. But the potential energy savings can be substantial.

Of course, for this to happen, we must be deliberate about scheduling our room usage ahead of time! I admit that I often am guilty of "finding an empty room" whenever I want to meet with someone. But for us to realize the potential savings that this process promises, I request that you and I plan ahead a little and contact Marti in the church office so she can make arrangements for the most efficient use of our space and energy.

The budget numbers in this report are from our approved balanced budget that only funds part of our Apportionment Benevolences. We are \$34,719 short of fully funding those Benevolences and plan to accomplish that funding with our Advent offering.

Our receipts for the year to date are \$17,419 above the budget (thanks to many who pledged contributing almost \$10,000 ahead of their scheduled pledges to date) and our expenses are \$52,967 below the budget putting us \$70,386 above the budget for the year.

We paid down our mortgages \$30,106 so far this year: \$26,160 from our budget and the remainder from contributions to the building fund and from interest saved because of early pay down of the mortgages.

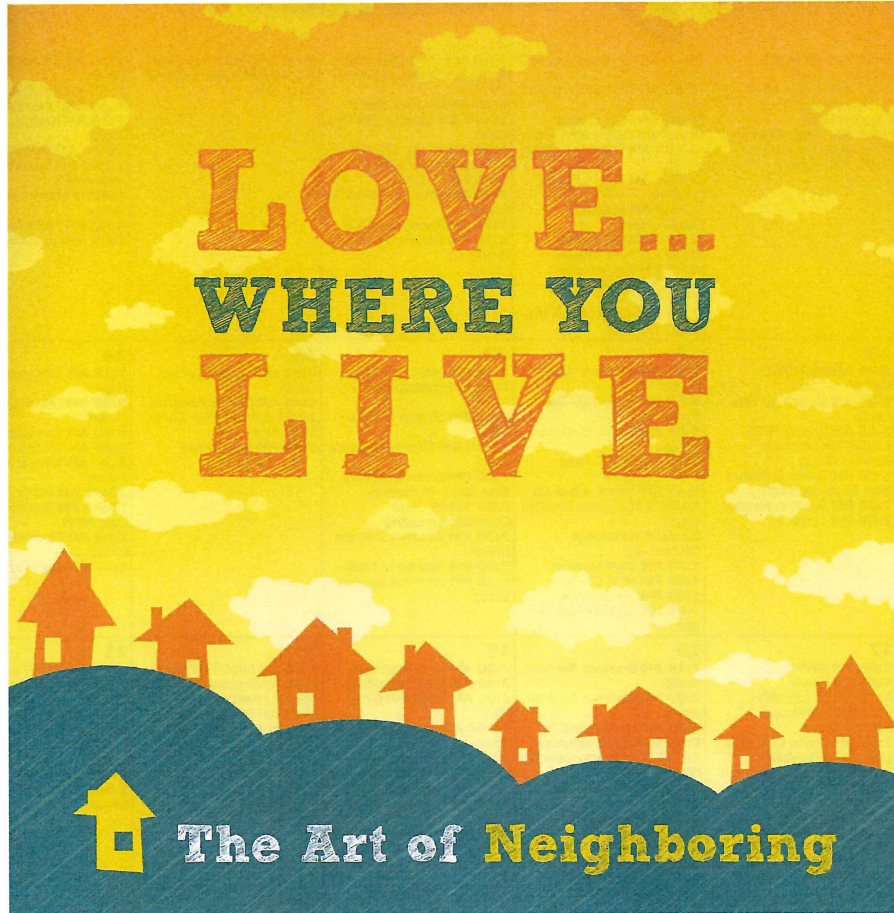

Books:

Miracle at the Higher Grounds Café. Max Lucado's new work of fiction is a warm fuzzy story set in a coffee shop in San Antonio. When one looks beneath the surface we discover the importance of being strong in faith, even when we feel our weakest and seeking God when the answers may not seem clear. As the story weaves through it's tale it shows the value of forgiveness in order to be free. It also details the importance of prayer, God's willingness to hear and respond to prayer and the presence of unseen spiritual forces. *Miracle at the Higher Grounds Cafe* is a story that could impact new believers, seekers, and seasoned Christians alike. Once you pick it up, you will not want to put it down!

A Trip Around the Sun: Turning Your Everyday Life into the Adventure of a Lifetime by Mark Batterson and Richard Foth. What happens when we take Jesus at his word when he says, "I have come

that you might have life and have it to the fullest?" *New York Times* bestselling author Mark Batterson and his mentor Richard Foth have done just that with their lives, and in *A Trip around the Sun* they show readers how they too can experience their life and faith as the ultimate adventure. In a fun, storytelling style, Mark and Dick challenge readers to shake off fear, dream big, and quit living as if the purpose of life is to arrive safely at death. Anyone who wants to grab life and squeeze every ounce of joy out of it will be inspired by this unapologetic celebration of the life Jesus died to give us.

DVDs:

Reflections on Psalm 23 - King David wrote what has become the most popular song in the history of the world. When you combine its comfort and courage then hope is generated. And hope is one of the most essential and valuable resources to help anyone suffering from any illness or difficulty in life. Ken Curtis went to Israel, home of David and the Psalm, to be with the shepherds, to travel through the valley of the shadow of death, and explore and enjoy the healing powers of the green pastures and still waters. He produced teaching mediations of the psalm incorporating peaceful music and beautiful scenery of the Holy Land. This is the first in a series of DVDs that was created to encourage and comfort those people dealing with cancer but it will feed the soul and give peace to anyone! Ken Curtis brings an in-depth and deep understanding to this psalm.

Reflections on the Beatitudes - Join Ken as he visits the location traditionally said to be where Jesus gave the Beatitudes, the opening to his Sermon on the Mount. He explores the richness and depth of the Beatitudes, and challenges us to find blessedness out of our brokenness. We see how they provide a whole new dimension to dealing with crisis or simply life in general. Like the Reflections on Psalm 23, this DVD was created for people going through cancer or a life crisis - however, it will give everyone a better understanding of what Jesus had in mind when he gave this sermon. The music is very peaceful, and the scenery is beautiful and directly from the Holy Land.

Both of these DVDs will be a true blessing to anyone who chooses to watch them! They would also be a good resource for the Stephen Ministry to share with their care receivers.

Audio Books:

God is Not Dead: Evidence for God in an Age of Uncertainty by Rice Broocks. The goal of this book is to help readers develop a faith that is real, credible, and strong enough to help others find faith in God. The current movie by the same name was based on this book. Readers will be empowered not only to talk about their own faith with confidence, but also to lead others to a relationship with Jesus. Your library also has the hardback version as well as the movie "God is Not Dead"!

Leading, Caring, Communicating: these three words describe the ministry of Lay Servants in the United Methodist Church. The Lay Servant curriculum is designed to continue to deepen one's faith, broaden one's perspective, and to strengthen one's capabilities in many dimensions.

This 2-day course will help you to appreciate worship as a collection of complementary parts designed to work together to inspire and to encourage a congregation, to understand how each part of a worship service fits into the whole, and to help develop meaningful, powerful worship services.
