THANK YOU to the 150+ volunteers who joined together to scoop, dump, weigh, seal, label and pack the dehydrated meals. The pallet of boxes from NWHills UMC will make its way to the Caribbean, helping to feed the people affected by the recent hurricanes.

Upbeat music played as everyone steadily focused on their tasks. Actual packaging time was about two and a half hours -- many hands made light work! Progress was measured by a loud "gong," which was rung by enthusiastic children after every 1,000 meals were boxed. Our contact at Rise Against Hunger, Catherine Mayfield, travels from Houston to Austin frequently to promote, organize, and execute meal-packaging events. Catherine's goal is to package 300,000 meals in one year, at which point an Austin warehouse can be established!

Dear Northwest Hills Family,

What a joy it has been for me to be a part of this great community. I remember coming here about 5 years and 4 months ago with just one baby. During my time here, the Lord was great to me by blessing me with 2 more children that call Northwest Hills UMC their home and can't wait to come to church every Sunday. This has been an amazing journey for me in that I have seen God in many places at this church throughout these years. I have seen God move in the Youth Ministry from a couple high school students to a Full class of 10-14 high school students in Sunday School. I have seen a couple of our youth teach Adults Sunday school class, help lead VBS, lead worship during youth Sunday, going from 7 kids in the afterschool to 25-35 weekly and many more. I have learned a lot from my time here and I received my call to nursing school at this church as well. 
