Why should we pray! God already knows our hearts, our desires, so why pray. We know prayer is important, there's enough of it in the Bible, and you can find all sorts of books on prayer. In addition, all the godly people we've met testify to the crucial nature of prayer in their lives. We know that Jesus prayed just about every chance he got. Yet we are often baffled about prayer and get discouraged. Sometimes we need a lift or a jolt to pray.

We are called to pray because we need a means to build our relationship with Christ. Prayer is a vehicle to build our loving relationship with Christ. Just as we need to spend time with our earthly family, we need to spend time with our Heavenly Father.

Second, we pray as it is an important instrument in our overcoming temptation. In Luke the scene is set, Jesus and His apostles left the upper room and navigated their way to Gethsemane. The apostles were troubled and confused about what they had heard. Jesus knew that the great temptations were soon to be before them. What did Christ mean when he said "you may not enter into temptation"? As he hung on the cross what did Christ do...he modeled what he had told us to do. He prayed so that he could warn off temptation. Usually we pray only after we yield to temptation, what about using prayer as our first option to bolster our courage and strength prior to temptations. Maybe if we prayed more, we would yield less. Our income for the month was \$6,084 below the budget and year to date income is \$3,800 below the budget. Expenses for the month were \$10,241 below budget and year to date are \$9,730 below the budget leaving us with a positive income for the year of \$5,930. The year to date expenses are skewed by an unbudgeted expenditure of \$21,994.77 for roof repair that was covered by insurance money received in December but the check to the contractor was not processed until January.

Our mortgage has been paid down \$18,457 so far this year with \$6,440 from additional contributions to pay down the mortgage.
