THE CHURCH COUNCIL serves as an administrative infrastructure to implement the mission and vision of Northwest Hills United Methodist Church. Administrative committees are composed of our Pastor Parish Relations Committee, Finance and Trustee Committees along with our Stewardship team. Missions and Ministries at Northwest Hills UMC are combined into our PURPOSE TEAM (led by Dick Lillie) and are individually represented by the chair of those committees as well as by the head of the Purpose Team. Together with our pastor and staff, this body makes the decisions required by our various responsibilities and works as a team to represent our church. The council acts as the adminis-

trative agency of the charge conference.

THE PASTOR PARISH RELATION COMMITTEE (PPRC) is the liaison between the staff and the congregation. Typically this is done in a monthly meeting (3rd Monday at 7:00 p.m.) with the Pastor and a diverse group of lay members. The committee consists of 9 lay members who each serve for 3 years. The lay members are purposefully selected because of their diverse backgrounds and work within the Church. The church Leadership Team is proposing a budget for 2008 that will accommodate expected cost of living increases and changes to our debt repayment as we start paying principal and interest on our mortgage in March instead of the interest only loan we are currently supporting. Specifically we are targeting to support our Missions outreach with 10% of our total budget (including expected special offerings and benevolences portion of Apportionments); proposing a 4% increase in Administration; a 4% personnel cost of living increase plus \$50,000 for additional staff needs to be determined by PPRC; increasing other expenses by 5%; and planning for a 5% increase in most Facilities expenses with a doubling of our Fixed Asset Replacement budget. This will require a 10.9% increase in our overall budget.





THE STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE of Northwest Hills UMC is not some select group of individuals who gather to plan fund raising campaigns; each and every one of us is responsible for the stewardship of our individual gifts and the gifts given corporately to the church in support of the Missions and Ministries of NWHUMC. 


