The budget numbers are from the approved budget that does not fund most of the benevolences part of our apportionments. Our receipts for the month are \$12,221 below this reduced budget and our expenses are \$12,230 below the budget putting us \$9 ahead of the budget for the month. Year-to-date we are \$35,389 ahead of the budget thanks to seven members who paid over \$36,000 in February to fully pay the increase in their pledges in response to our secondary effort for added pledges to help us approach a balanced budget that fully funds our ministries for 2014.

We paid down our mortgages \$62,232 so far this year: \$41,100 from our budget and the remainder from continuing contributions to the building fund and reduced interest payments due to early principal payments.

The Star of Bethlehem DVD explores the exciting truth of scripture and reveals the evidence for God as seen in the stars. Using Starry software, first century manuscripts, and the Bible, Frederick Larsen ascertained the critical date of King Herod's death, the nine characteristics of "The Star," and information on the blood moon. He carefully shares his evidence and makes an excellent case for how the heavens announce the birth of the Messiah, mark the arrival of the Magi for the first Christmas, and mark His passing with a lunar eclipse on the day of his crucifixion. It shows how God forecast his glory in the heavens!


The Nativity Story DVD tells one of the most beloved stories in scripture of how Jesus came into being through the spoken word of God and how a young couple was willing to accept His will and put aside their own desires. This is the beloved story of the birth of our Lord and savior.

The Christmas Angel DVD: Olivia makes a Christmas wish for her mom to find a husband. And though this movie contains some romance (slowly budding and heart-stirring) it is more about the discovery of God's hand behind the scenes and the amazing way He works. The Christmas Angels' message is very simple, one the whole family can relate to in that all things are possible when you believe and trust in God.

Christmas with a Capital C: In this DVD, God's love triumphs over political correctness with a gentle reminder that without Christ there would be no Christmas. A new person in town takes offense to the town nativity scene. Reacting to Mitch Bight's encroachment on their comfortable nativity tradition, the townspeople get nowhere. But, when they allow themselves to be humbled and seek God's grace and guidance, things turn around.

In the Max Lucado story, *Christmas Child*, Christmas is a time to share faith, laughter, tears, and belief. Its gifts are not always those that can be unwrapped under the Christmas tree. In this movie, life-changing events are viewed as they are "unwrapped" as the movie progresses. Sometimes life is not perfect and we need to search for the truth. Stephen Curtis Chapman, Megan Follows, and William Moses make the true spirit of Christmas come alive in this heart-warming film about love and redemption.

God Came Near, by Max Lucado, is the story of God's perfect son, Jesus Christ. "The glory of the Lord was shining around the shepherds, and they became very afraid." Good thing the shepherd's lingered, otherwise they might have missed the glorious birth. Travel back in time and encounter Christ, the Son of God, whose first cries were heard by a peasant girl and a sleepy carpenter. Join Max Lucado as he brings to life the most important event in history: when God came near.
