2016 ANNUAL CONFERENCE

Once again I was honored to attend the **Rio Texas Annual Conference** in Corpus Christi representing NWHUMC along with Pastors Charlie and Audrey, Bill Cain, and Mandy Goss. This was the second year of the new combined **Rio Texas Conference**. There were approximately 1500 delegates representing over 400 churches in this conference.

Since the 2015 Annual Conference, Bishop James Dorff resigned and four Bishops from outside the Rio Texas Conference were asked to continue the administrative work of the conference until a new Bishop is appointed. The appointment of the new Bishop will be in September of this year.

Bishop Robert Schnase chaired the plenary meetings and gave the message Just Say Yes: Unleashing People for Ministry. His message came from his book of the same title. His presentation was a walk through his book dealing with innovation. The focus of his message was to allow freedom of the ministries to take action instead of having to go through a heavy handed church bureaucracy. The goal of all ministries is to bear fruit, not to establish another form of church structure.

He shared that the local church should work with gifted people to allow them to experiment and to be proactive in working in areas that can bear more fruit instead of the normal and established processes of the church. The church should find out what is working in other churches and see how their ideas can be implemented locally.

He used the example of the pyramid. In this organization structure, it is obvious that those in charge reside at the top. He stated that a tightly controlled, centralized model seldom helps the church flourish.

He suggested a different model, the upside-down pyramid where the pastors see their task as one of undergirding, and support; to provide what is necessary for the ministries of the church. In turn, the staff and lead volunteers understand their mission is to provide the foundation of equipping, leading and training that allows others to serve, grow and lead. From my perspective, that is what we have been developing over the past two years. I see NWHUMC already on the road to training and equipping disciples with the use of our tools such as the Compass and lists of ministries and contacts.

In June we said our goodbyes to **Charlie and Heidi**. They have lead and supported NWHUMC through LOVE, sound doctrine and a focus towards looking and serving outward--to the mission field. We of course will miss them but also look forward to growing our mission impact with a new pastor. Effective in July, we welcome **Pastor Laura Brewster**.

STOP HUNGER NOW.

What if your fond memories of plentiful food were replaced with feelings of anxiety? What if you were unable to provide enough food for your family - tonight? What if your son or daughter says he or she is "starving," but you could only respond with "I'm sorry"?

The United Nations Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) estimates that nearly 870 million people of the 7.2 billion people in the world, or one in eight, were suffering from chronic under -nourishment in 2010-2012. 852 million people in developing countries alone are hungry. Children are the most visible victims of inadequate nutrition. Children who are poorly nourished suffer up to 160 days of illness each year. These facts are difficult to comprehend – don't we live in a world that has unparalleled wealth and food production capacity?

The task of trying to resolve the problem of hunger and poverty is by no means simple. It involves many layers of socio-economic and political structures and systems that may be difficult to influence or control. But as a church that follows Christ's teachings, we have a responsibility to share the blessings that God has bestowed upon us!

In the face of tough economic times, it might be easier to tighten our own belts and make sure that <u>we</u> have enough. But Jesus called us to take care of others like they were our own mother, brother or sister. In the gospel account of the feeding the five thousand (Mark 6:30-37), it is Jesus that tells the disciples: "**YOU** give them something to eat."

Northwest Hills UMC invites you and your family to make a commitment to help **Stop Hunger Now.** Over the summer months, you will learn about the meal-packaging event taking place here on September 25, from 2-4 PM. <u>Wildflower DVD and discussion guide:</u> This film brings to light the fact that God is always present in our lives and even closer to us when we are going through difficult times. The knowledge that God's timing and purposes are not always within our comprehension is a prevailing theme within the movie as well. There is a discussion guide included which would make it perfect for a small group or individual study.

<u>Patterns of Evidence Exodus DVD:</u> This film unlocks the mystery of the ancient Exodus saga, combining a scientific investigation with a retelling of the Exodus story to reveal an amazing pattern of evidence matching the Biblical account that may challenge our understanding of history. It features interviews with leading archaeologists and guest appearances by Israel's Benjamin Netanyahu and Shimon Peres.

<u>Miracles From Heaven DVD:</u> Anna Beam has spent most of her childhood in and out of hospitals with a rare incurable digestive disorder. One day while playing with her sisters, she falls headfirst into a hollowed out tree. As rescue workers struggle to get her out, she visits heaven and experiences a miracle. This film is a wonderful reminder that the God of the present is still in the business of creating amazing miracles. It will warm your heart and grow your faith!

<u>Jerusalem Center of the World PBS Home Video:</u> This story captures the rich mosaic of the city's Christian, Jewish and Muslim communities. Covering a sweeping history of over 4,000 years, the film explores the founding of the city, birth and convergence of the world's three major monotheistic religions, and the key events in Jerusalem's history as described in the Hebrew and Christian Bibles, the Talmue, the Hagaddah, the Koran and the Hadith. Highlights include: Mount Moriah, the site of the First and Second Temples; the Church of the Holy Sepulcher; the Dome of the Rock; and the Western Wall.

<u>Risen DVD:</u> This story is told from the viewpoint of a Roman tribune who was sent to investigate the whereabouts of the missing body of Jesus. When he finally discovers Jesus and his disciples hiding out he is forced to choose the real truth or the story to protect the empire. This new twist to an old story lets you see what choices an unbeliever can make when introduced to our Risen Lord. This is great for skeptics and believers alike!

Our income is \$8,640 above our budget for May, but year to date is \$13,946 below our budget and we did not pay the Benevolence part of our Apportionments in March, April, and May (total \$11,404) because of our reduced income. The major part of our expected income in our budget is from members who pledge and that has improved from 88% of expected pledge income through April to 92% so far this year. If income continues to improve, we plan to pay our delinquent Apportionments.

We paid down our mortgages \$21,915 so far this year.

DRIVE A SENIOR




