## OUTREACH EVENTS A SUCCESS!

### YOUTH MISSION TRIP July 2—July 8, 2017

A hardworking group of teenaged "ambassadors" from NW Hills UMC (and their adult chaperones) spent the week of July 2-8 serving others in southeast Louisiana.

They rode in a church van for 8 hours each way to get to The Epworth Center in Slidell (outside of New Orleans). Each night they slept in dorm rooms full of bunk beds. They rose early each morning, packed sack lunches, and set off to work on home repairs and maintenance for needy people whose homes suffered flood damage. They worked tirelessly each day, repairing homes in the steamy Louisiana heat. They worked in dusty, torn-up construction areas and in tiny filthy bathrooms. They learned to rewire electrical outlets, install sinks, mud and sand sheetrock, and install crown moulding.

Their most important work didn't seem like work at all. They met and visited with people who needed someone to hear their stories. Some of the teens worked in the bathroom of a very TINY house where a family of 4 lived. The mother of the family was a young woman who had lived on the same water-filled street, literally in the swamp, her entire life.

Some teens worked on a house for a widow with back and neck problems. She was caring for her adorable little granddaughter. The two of them were holed-up in one room of their house with the dog while the entire rest of the house was under construction.

Several of the teens listened patiently to "Ms. Tonni," a woman who shared her harrowing tale of being rescued from a flood. Almost everything she owned was damaged and she had to leave her home by boat! When Tonni saw that the teens had installed a sink in her

bathroom, she broke out in tears of joy! She had not been able to wash her hands or brush her teeth in her bathroom for over 10 months!


The mission trip wasn't all construction work. One day the youth toured New Orleans. They learned about the impact recent weather-related disasters have had on the city and surrounding areas. They learned about the culture, architecture, food, music and people of "the most unique city." They swam in Lake Pontchartrain and counted FIVE alligators in a nearby pond.

During lunch breaks on worksites, the youth had devotionals. They led one another in discussions and took turns praying. In the evenings, after everyone showered and ate dinner, they enjoyed the fellowship of silly games and joy-filled teenaged conversation. The bonds between them strengthened and friendships blossomed.

This is what church is meant to be! A youth mission trip is really just a microcosm of the entire Christian experience. Together as Christians, we journey, we break bread, we serve others, we worship, we pray, we learn, we laugh, and we love! Together, we share God's love! One more thing not mentioned above, four of the twelve teens on the trip were not regular members of NW Hills UMC. They were friends and cousins invited by church members to join the fun. They came, were fully accepted into the group, and worked hard alongside the youth who were church members. That's another way Christians spread God's love! We invite and we include!"

## RISE AGAINST HUNGER



For Haitian Samarah Joacchim, a 7th-grader, school means life and hope for a future. For Samarah and millions of children around the world, attending school means she will eat that day. ***"Without food I would be starving and my grades would be lower. Most of us rely on the food served at school to survive; this is the only meal we get for the day. I hope the feeding program will continue."***

Last fall, over 150 church members, families and friends came to our Youth Center to package 19,008 meals, after raising \$5,512.32. The meals were sent to Rise Against Hunger's partner, Family Legacy, in Zambia. Family Legacy operates 17 schools in the slums around Lusaka, Zambia, providing education to thousands of orphans and vulnerable children daily. The 5,500 children attending their schools are fed one meal (lunch) every day, so Rise Against Hunger meals are critical to their development and education.

On September 17, Northwest Hills UMC will package at least 15,550 meals with Rise Against Hunger, but we need your help. Please consider contributing to our goal of \$4,500. ## OWL CAMP A SUCCESS

Northwest Hills UMC is working hard this summer to help prepare children for another successful school year.

Children can fall behind on their reading ability during the summer months. This is particularly true for children from other nations who are still learning to read in English. So this summer, our church launched OWL Reading Camp, a program that pairs children with youth or adult reading buddies.

Twenty five children attended OWL Reading Camp. A number of those children are refugees from Iran, Afghanistan, and Iraq. The camp also drew immigrants from China and Turkey. Local children were invited to participate as well.

The Owl Reading Camp was the brainchild of Youth Director Solange Woodson and church member Dee Susong who is the chairperson of our church's Mission's Team. Reading programs are Dee's area of expertise. She is an Academic Language Therapist with Austin ISD.

Numerous volunteers helped make the program a success. More than 25 different volunteers took part in the OWL Reading Camp. Some read with children, others cooked lunch, helped with crafts, or led games and music. George, the Bow Wow Reading Dog, was also on campus to lend a hand, or rather, a paw. George is a therapy dog from Austin Dog Alliance.

Dee Susong anticipates offering the OWL Reading Camp again next summer.
