



December Church Calendar Events

Las Posadas (Spanish for "the inns") is an Advent celebration that symbolizes Mary and Joseph's frustrating search for an inn where they could rest and where Jesus could be born. The tradition is based on the story told in Luke 2:1-7.

The congregation will be invited to join "Mary" and "Joseph" as they process around our neighborhood in search of a place to rest. "Mary" and "Joseph" will ask for lodging – and be refused entry – at three predesignated apartments. The group will then process to the Family Life Center where they will ask for shelter. 
Oct. 11-14, 2018

PRAYING A BLESSING OVER OTHERS

Most Christians are faithful about praying intercessory prayers for our family and friends, but we are not quite as confident offering a blessing over others. It blesses us to bless others and also fulfills the biblical admonition to "let your conversation be always full of grace" (Col 4:6) and to "encourage one another and build each other up"

(I Thes 5:11). The best known blessing is the Aaronic Blessing found in Numbers 6: 24 – 26.

It is of interest to see the Hebrew view of it. God gave the words to Moses when things were going very well in the wilderness. The tabernacle had been completed so God wanted to bless his people. He told Moses that he wanted Aaron to use the words recorded in Numbers 6 to bless the Israelites. "Bless you" meant that God was coming on bended knee to give his people a gift. The Hebrew word for "keep" implied a fence made of briars that was built around their animals to protect them from predators. My favorite is the meaning of "his face shine upon you".

There are many blessings found in the Bible, and I urge you to try using one to bless your children, spouse, family members and friends. Here is my blessing for each of you:

May the love of the Father, the tenderness of the Son, and the presence of the Spirit gladden your heart and bring peace to our soul this day and for all days.





Yancey aims this book /DVD at Christians, showing them how Christians have lost respect, influence, and reputation in a newly post-Christian culture. He offers illuminating stories of how faith can be expressed in ways that disarm even the most cynical critics.

Then he explores what is Good News and what is worth preserving in a culture that thinks it has rejected Christian faith.

CATCH - A CHURCH WIDE PROGRAM FOR INVITATIONAL EVANGELISM
(DVD Study and Leader's Guide by Adam Hamilton) This was developed for his UMC and it shows you how to attract visitors to your church,

AUTOPSY OF A DECEASED CHURCH - 12 WAYS TO KEEP YOURS ALIVE (Book

by Thom Rainer) In his work Rainer has discovered 12 themes among those churches that have died and has developed 12 lessons on how to keep your church alive.

BECOMING A WELCOMING CHURCH (Book by Thom Rainer) In almost all of Rainer's consultations, church members perceive their church to be friendly but the guests felt that the members were mainly friendly to one another. He guides members toward a practical framework for making a difference for those who visit their church.

WE WANT YOUR HERE (Book by Thom Rainer) This is a warmhearted book that introduces the ministry of the local church to guests ,tells visitors that you want to know them, that you believe in strengthening families, and that you're inviting them to join you in worship and in making a difference in Christ's name. It is a small book that can be given out as a welcome gift to guests.

WHO MOVED MY PULPIT (Book by Thom Rainer) Rainer shares an 8 stage roadmap to leading change in the church. Not by changing biblical foundations but by changing methodologies and approaches for reaching a rapidly changing culture.

Our income for the month was \$13,421 above the budget and year to date income is \$9,621 above the budget. Expenses for the month were \$3,679 above budget and year to date are \$9,800 below the budget leaving us with a positive income for the year of \$19,420. The year to date expenses are skewed by an unbudgeted expenditure of \$21,994.77 for roof repair that was covered by insurance money received in December but the check to the contractor was not processed until January.

Our mortgage has been paid down \$22,387 so far this year with \$6,580 from additional contributions to pay down the mortgage.
